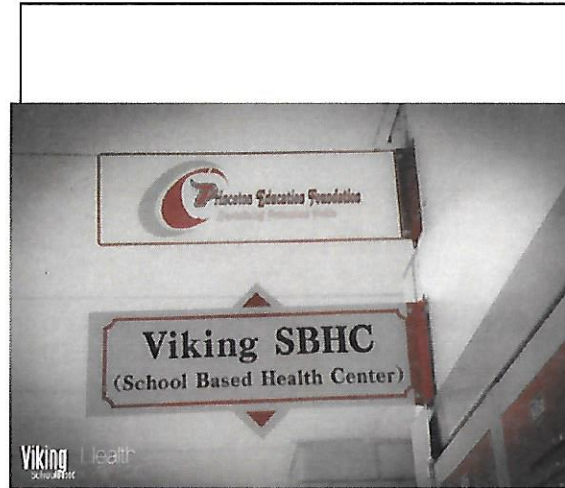
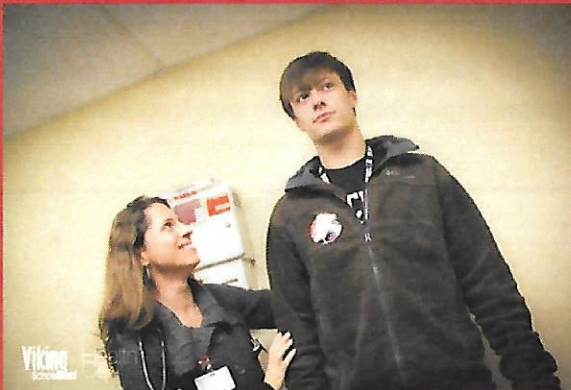


Fees For Services

THCC will bill health insurance, including Medicaid and Medicare, when available. Families with no health insurance or who do not provide insurance information are referred to the Medicaid Eligibility Specialist for screening to see if they qualify for the Ohio Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). Families with no health insurance also will be billed for services provided to their children based on a sliding-fee scale using family income and size to determine the service discount.

No one is turned away for inability to pay.

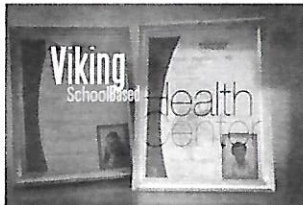

What Is the Viking School-Based Health Center (VSBHC)

The VSBHC is like a doctor's office within the school providing a great benefit to students. For students without a primary healthcare provider, VSBHC staff may become that provider. Research shows that school-based health centers can help a student manage his/her illness(es) at school and, therefore, decrease absenteeism from school and parents' time away from work as well as fewer hospitalizations and trips to the emergency room. If a student is sick they have the opportunity to be treated without delay. A student that is healthy and shows up to class is better equipped for academic success. The VSBHC is not intended to replace the school nurse or a student's primary physician—but can become an important member of the student's health care team.

Who We Serve

All students who are registered at the middle or high school are eligible to receive services, provided there is a consent form signed by a parent/legal guardian on file. Parents are not required to attend visits with their child.

Staff

VSBHC staff includes a Certified Nurse Practitioner (CNP), Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN), a board certified collaborating physician, and a Medicaid Eligibility Specialist.



Primary Care Services

- Routine physical exams, including sports/work/school/camp physicals
- Treatment and management of acute and chronic conditions
- Treatment of minor injuries, suture removal
- Prescription medications
- Immunizations and injections
- Basic lab tests (rapid strep, urine dipstick, urine pregnancy test, hemoglobin, glucose, sexually transmitted disease testing)
- Oral health assessments
- Mental/behavioral health screening
- Health education
- Referral to dental and other specialty providers
- Consultation/coordination with school contracted behavioral health providers
- Access to services at other THCC locations when the VSBHC is closed during the summer or other school breaks
- 24/7 telephone access to a THCC provider

The VSBHC staff will not provide family planning/contraceptive services, abortion counseling or referrals.

Other Services

- Interpreter services
- Help applying for Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) coverage, and prescription drug assistance
