2019's outbreak is the largest since 1994.
When Should I think about Measles?


This is the greatest number of cases reported in the U.S. since measles was eliminated in 2000.

## Complications of Measles

- Pneumonia is the \#1 cause of pediatric measles-related deaths
- Diarrhea, stomatitis, conjunctivitis, and keratitis (may lead to blindness) may occur
- Encephalitis is rare



## What are the symptoms?

- Red maculopapular rash that starts on head and spreads down
- Becomes confluent
- Fades in order of appearance



## Remember the 3 Cs:

- Cough
- Coryza (runny nose)
- Conjunctivitis (red eyes)



Has the patient received all age-appropriate Vaccines for MEASLES?

First dose at $12-15$ months
95\% protective Second dose at 4-6 years 99\% protective


## Testing for Suspected

 Measles- Consult with the local/state health departments and local Infectious Diseases specialists for guidance
- Measles IgM (may need to be repeated if initial test is negative because false-negatives may be noted during the first 72 hours of rash onset)
- Serum and throat swabs for measles RNA by PCR (send out test ran at state public health laboratories)
- Measles IgG (presence suggests immunity)
